Has the wind been blowing almost every Friday on our Trash Days??? It definitely seems like it! Alpine Waste and Recycling would like to make some suggestions. Our covenants state that trash is to be put in tightly, lidded containers and put out with the cover in place. This covenant is important because TrailMark is a natural habitat for animals-bears, raccoons, coyotes and other critters. If all of us do just this: using the lids with the containers; then this will help to keep the trash from sailing all over TrailMark and will also keep our wildlife from helping themselves to a free meal. It is also suggested that you label your containers and your lids with your address. If neighbors find these lids and containers down the block, they can return them to you. Regarding recycling, here are some more suggestions. Alpine wants you to use covered recycling containers. Again we suggest you place your address on the cover and on the container and label it "Recycle." (Alpine even sells these containers for \$48.77 delivered.) Under no circumstance should the recycled items be placed in plastic bags and labeled "recycling!" Alpine does not recycle plastic bags, so the plastic bags with recycled items in them will be thrown away as trash. Please check Alpine's website for more information regarding what types of items can be recycled or call them at 303-744-9881 if you have any questions or wish to schedule a large item pickup.

As a deterrent to theft, please keep your garage doors closed at all times. An open garage door is an invitation to humans and also to animals. We have had some burglaries and also vandalism when garage doors have been left open. Open garage doors also detract from the beauty of the neighborhood too.

Lastly, your HOA Board members have remained the same as last year. Happy New Year from the TMMD Board of Directors. We hope that this is a happy and healthy year for everyone.

Financial - Mill Levy Reduction

In December 2010, the TMMD Board certified our budget and as part of that voted unanimously to decrease the mill levy rate from 42.5 mills to 35 mills which everyone should have seen on their Jefferson County Colorado Property Tax Statement Tax Notice that was mailed in January 2011. This mill levy rate allows the TMMD to run The District's operations and continue to pay the infrastructure bond payments.

Communication – Meeting Schedule and Website

In 2011, the TMMD will be moving to semi-monthly regular meetings. The dates for those meetings are; February 15; April 19; June 21; August 16; October 18 and December 20. We will also have a budget meeting on November 15. All meetings are currently scheduled for 6:30 PM at the TrailMark Learning Center.

The TMMD and HOA Boards will continue to hold the Coffee at the Playground gatherings in May, July and September. Please look for the signage the week before the gatherings. This is a good opportunity for those residents who are not able to attend either the TMMD or HOA regular meetings to get questions answered or to bring items to the attention of board members.

The TMMD's Communications Committee has signed a contract to have our website updated and integrated with the HOA website. We hope to have this completed by the first quarter of 2011 and will communicate this once it is operational. You can currently get up-to-date information regarding the TMMD at www.tmmd.org including meeting minutes and budget information. The TMMD's By-Laws Committee continues to write the By-Laws for the TMMD and is hopeful that this can be completed by this summer.

Ponds - Treatment

During the summer of 2010, Fairview Reservoir had a serious invasive aquatic plant and algae issue which killed off many of the fish in the pond due to the low levels of oxygen. The TMMD is working to make sure that this does not occur again. Beginning in April all of the ponds in TrailMark will be on a treatment schedule to make sure that algae and weeds to not deplete the oxygen levels creating another serious problem. We are also working with the Division of Wildlife and Iris Mitigation to re-stock the fish at Fairview Reservoir.

Design Review Committee

Homeowners!! It time to consider your outside projects for 2011!! The Design Review Committee (DRC) is ready to assist you with getting your projects approved and is providing this update on the guidelines you should consider during planning. Remember, projects that are external to the house require DRC approval prior to initiating the actual project.

Exterior Projects include:

Exterior house painting

Landscaping

Changes to the exterior of the home such as solar systems, and home additions

Exterior buildings/projects such as sheds, greenhouses, decks, patios, fencing

Projects that affect the interior yard (inside the fencing)

Request Process:

The TrailMark Design Guidelines dated April 2002 provide the guidance to plan and submit requests. The Guidelines can be found at:

http://trailmarkhoa.org/docs/TrailMark_Design_Guidelines.pdf.

All requests for Exterior Projects are submitted to Colorado Management, Inc., TrailMark's management company, who consolidates and provides the information to the DRC for consideration.

The DRC meets to review the requests, generally twice monthly, and returns their decision to Colorado Management, Inc. who will follow-up in writing to the homeowner.

To plan and submit a request, see paragraph D. Review Process and the What to Submit paragraphs for specifics.

When submitting your request, imagine that you are reviewing the request for approval. Do you have everything necessary in order to visualize the completed project so that you can make a judgment that is conducive to the general appeal of the neighborhood?

PLEASE NOTE: In accordance with TrailMark's Design Guidelines, page 12, "It is extremely important to receive approval before commencing work. Failure to do so may result in removal or modification of improvements by the Owner." Please get your projects DRC approved prior to initiating!!!

Landscape Projects:

The intent of the landscape guidelines is to assist Owners so that the project is consistent with the spirit of TrailMark land plans and the overall Design Guidelines.

Landscaping projects are governed by paragraph G. Landscape Design Guidelines and Procedures in the Design Guidelines. Addressed in this paragraph is landscape project considerations, landscape review process, design considerations.

Exterior Painting Projects:

TrailMark was designed such that the community would blend with Colorado's surrounding, natural beauty, incorporating trails, ponds, and native vegetation as a compliment to the home and yard designs. In keeping with this theme, the exterior paint color combinations were chosen to compliment and blend with that natural beauty. The colors selected are generally referred to as "earth tones". The DRC is committed to adhering to "earth tone" combinations to maintain a consistent, attractive appearance throughout TrailMark.

To assist homeowners, books with the approved color combinations are available for your use. It is these color combinations upon which the DRC bases its decision on each exterior painting project application.

The original colors follow the same theme:

Siding – Light, earth tones (beiges, tans, browns)

Fascia, Trim, Shutters – Generally, three accent colors to compliment the siding color

Front Entry, Garage Doors – One or two colors to round out the color scheme.

Please Note: The DRC also appreciates the desire of some homeowners to add a unique quality to their home, therefore will consider some variations to shutters, some accents, and front doors.



TrailMark has three home design series – 400, 500, and 600. Homeowners may select an approved color combination from any of the three series. That is, if your house is a 500 series, you may select a color combination from the 400, 500, or 600 series.

If a homeowner wishes to paint other than an approved color combination, the homeowner must submit: Proposed paint color names and numbers; Paint "chips"/samples; Proposed location for each color (siding, trim, shutters, doors, etc.).

Homeowners may review the TrailMark Exterior Color Scheme books by submitting a request to Colorado Management, Inc.

Construction Regulations:

Homeowners should review paragraph F. Construction Period Regulations and share this information with their contractor(s). This paragraph addresses:

Detailed construction plans to be provided to the DRC

Use of trailers, sheds, and temporary structures, and trash removal

Construction hours

Disposition for excavation material, construction material, trash and equipment Dust, noise and odor concerns

DRC Meetings:

The DRC meets the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month. All applications should be received by Hammersmith the Friday previous to the DRC meeting. Failure to provide complete information to the DRC will delay the review and approval of your application. If documentation is absent from the application, the application will be returned to the homeowner with a written request for additional information which will be reviewed at the next appropriate DRC meeting.

All questions regarding exterior projects for the Design Review Committee's consideration should be directed to Colorado Management, Inc.

Save Big \$\$\$ by Performing Your Own Water Audit

When District staff performs a water audit, the most often unknown use of water is a leaking toilet.

Checking a Toilet for Leaks

Sometimes toilet leaks aren't seen or heard. It is a good idea to check for a leaking toilet at least once a year

- 1. Remove Tank Lid.
- 2. Put 5-6 drops of food coloring or a dye strip (free at the District) in the tank.
- 3. After 10 minutes, look in the bowl if you see color, you have a leak. The main causes of a leak are either a "fill valve" that will not shut off or a bad "flapper".

Fill valve problem

A fill valve problem will cause water to flow over the "overflow tube," either because the water level is set too high or it won't shut the water off. If you can't adjust the water level lower or can't get the fill valve to shut off, replace the fill valve.

Bad flapper

If you had water run into the bowl during the dye test and the water level is not set too high, your flapper is probably leaking and it should be replaced. If your old flapper has a float on the chain, make sure your new one does too (or put the old float on the new chain).

When replacing a toilet flapper, remember that it is very important to replace it with the proper flapper model for your toilet. Using a standard flapper in many 1.6 gallon toilets can make the toilet flush up to 3.5 gallons per flush.

Covenant Corner

The Covenant Committee has identified good neighbors for our community. The Good Neighbor program is run by the Covenant Committee to promote and reinforce a positive incentive for not receiving a covenant violation. Two TrailMark community addresses which have not received violation letters for the quarter receive a \$100 gift card. Congratulation to our winners for helping to keep our neighborhood beautiful.

With the help of volunteers and the new management company, a courtesy letter is being designed for distribution prior to a violation letter being sent. This is a letter to notify the homeowner that there could be a violation letter coming if the problem is not rectified. The new management company is dedicated to work together with the homeowner to address the violations, while still acknowledging that our homeowners have chosen to live in a covenant controlled community.



Common Area Commíttee

The Common Area Committee (CAC) continues to work toward retaining a "natural Colorado foothill's feel" as intended by the development's original landscape and planting plan. Over the winter this committee has been laying groundwork to forward existing projects and new projects for 2011. Community signage, improvements to our parks and trails, plus continued attention to the

plants within our common areas highlight our focus for 2011.

We are continuing to explore brackets to hold temporary community event banners on the large out-going monument. This specific monument is correctly sized and oriented toward traffic plus it is already lit! By using it we are able to keep the Parkway free of additional sign framing structures that would add visual clutter and sit un-used for weeks. We are in process of finding/designing a low-profile bracket that will seem to "disappear" when not in use. Once a bracket is specified, we will also provide the community with a set of guidelines recommending banner dimensions, font sizes, etc.

In partnership with South Suburban Parks and Recreation (SSPRD), the CAC has applied and been awarded grant funding from the 2011 Jefferson County Open Space Advisory Committee to improve the restroom facilities at Hogback Hill Park. We have also been given funding to add signage within TrailMark to help Jeffco Open Space trail users navigate through our neighborhood. SSPRD is reviewing City of Littleton sewer codes to understand if we may install a vault-type toilet or simply screen the Port-o-Let with a metal shelter.

Summer sport practices held at Hogback Hill Park are presenting this community with a parking and safety issue at TrailMark Parkway and Holland. This winter the TrailMark Metropolitan District (TMMD) helped the CAC and SSPRD forward this concern with the City of Littleton public works department. We have been given permission to open an area of grassland at the park for temporary overflow parking. This should help alleviate some of the congestion and increase safety for pedestrians. Logistics are still underway.

Given the above interests at Hogback Hill Park, this committee is requesting SSPRD to help us develop a basic "master plan" to help guide us in the future. For example, a master plan will help us to know where we may locate tree donations with the assurance that we are not limiting future facilities. As well, it will help keep improvements within an agreed upon context. Stay tuned for more communication as the planning process gets underway.

To end, this committee would also like to recognize Doug Filter for his contributions to TrailMark as member of the CAC. Doug spearheaded the community garden initiative and through his research forged an early connection for TrailMark with the CSA garden at the Denver Botanic Gardens at Chatfield. Although it has become necessary for him to step away from the CAC, we will continue to enjoy his contributions as part of our HOA Board.


