It has been an eventful spring with goslings munching on the grass and a visit from two elk by Fairview #1. The HOA and the TMMD will be hosting the City of Littleton



Staff this Tuesday, May 22nd from 4:30-6:30 pm. The Mayor, City Council Members and the City Staff will be there to meet neighbors. There will be free pizza, ice cream and drinks under the big, red tent at the park. There will be a fire engine, a police car and an exercise van for kids of all ages to enjoy. This meeting will be casual with the City of Littleton staff answering questions and listening to your concerns. So come join us.

The last HOA meeting brought concerned homeowners who had questions about the recreational vehicle policy. The HOA Board listened to all who were there and then decided that the 48



hour City of Littleton policy would remain the same but the number of times that a recreational vehicle could be in the neighborhood would not be limited. This would mean that you would have to load within the 48 hours; leave on your trip, then return to unload for no more than 48 hours.

It was also discussed that if a neighbor feels as though another neighbor is abusing the 48 hour City of Littleton rule, then the neighbor can call the City of Littleton and request that the police

come out and visit the offending neighbor. That neighbor can be cited and will have to make a court appearance. So we ask that all recreational vehicle owners be courteous within TrailMark and keep the City of Littleton rules.

Moreover, neighbors will not have to phone the management company to register their recreational vehicle as to dates that the vehicle will be on their property. Privacy was the main reason cited. No one wants a list kept as to which families are home and which families are away. The HOA Board thanks those neighbors who attended the meeting and gave us their input. The HOA Board does listen.

The first Fairview #1 Lake Cleanup Day will be held on Saturday, June 9th. Watch for signs, brochures and information posted on Facebook. Come out and help us keep the wildlife habitat safe.

As summer approaches we would like to remind everyone that we will be enjoying three concerts at Hogback Hill Park on June 24th, July 22nd and August 26th. The TrailMark Garage Sale will be held on June 8th and 9th. There will not be a map this year but Sunny Puckett will place ads in the newspapers and on Craig's list. 

May 2012 Election:

In May 2012, there were two TrailMark Metro District Board positions up for election. There were only 2 Self Nominations completed and as a result the May 2012 TMMD Election was cancelled. The TMMD welcomed Curt Fankhouser to the Board on Tuesday, May 15th where he was sworn in to a 4 year term. Patty Durso, who completed the other Self Nomination Form, will not be taking office as her and her husband will be moving out of state due to a career move. The TMMD wishes Patty and her husband well as they embark on a new adventure. As a result of Patty not taking office there is a vacant position available on the TMMD. Beaver Pond:

The trees around the Beaver Pond have continued to disappear due to several beavers that have taken up residence. In 2011 the Metro District safely relocated several beavers in an attempt to remove them and save the trees that are located around the pond. TMMD spent several thousand dollars mitigating the beavers but they continued to come back and do what they do best, chop down trees. TMMD decided in April 2012, after consulting with the Colorado Division of Wildlife, that the Metro District would wrap the trees around the Beaver pond with wire mesh as a way to save the remaining trees. This project was completed in May 2012. Homeowners living around the pond are urged to wrap the trees in their backyards as the

beavers may still look for a source of fuel until it is exhausted and they decide to move on.

TrailMark Fire Service Taskforce: Members of the Metro District, HOA Board and Littleton City Council have formed a TrailMark Task Force regarding Fire Protection Services for TrailMark. Together we have met with the Littleton Fire Chief and the Littleton City Manager to discuss service options for TrailMark. The focus of this task force is to discuss options to reduce TrailMark response times as well as to mitigate any drop in the ISO rating for TrailMark for insurance purposes. This is an ongoing task force with meetings scheduled in 2012. We will keep you updated as this progresses.

Meetings:

The Metro District meets every other month on the 3rd Tuesday of the month at the TrailMark Learning Center. The remaining meetings are in May, July, September and November. We invite you to attend! The Metro District also coordinates the Coffee @ The Playground gatherings with the HOA Board. There will be 2 additional Playground gatherings this summer in June and August. A few residence, living along the open space, close to Reservoir #2 (Beaver Pond) and adjacent to the trails, consider those area's there own garbage dump.

Items being dumped include grass clippings, leaves, tree branches, dog feces, etc. All of these items should be put in your garbage. The HOA, using your dues, provides weekly garbage pick up from Alpine Waste.

Cleaning up the unauthorized dumping is being paid from your Property Taxes. The last Beaver Pond clean up was \$2,200.
