We have created a self-guided survey to help you determine the level of wildfire risk for your home. It only takes a few minutes to complete and is a great place to start.

Home Risk Assessment

Reverse 9-1-1

This will notify you of emergencies and natural or man-made disasters, such as missing persons, law enforcement activity, evacuation notices, and more.

Reverse 911 Jefferson County

Defending the Home Ignition Zone

- 1 Create a defensible space
- 2 Keep rain gutters clear of leaves and pine needles
- 3 Do not use the area on or under decks for storage
- 4 Rake up pine needles and leaves
- 5 Use fire-resistant landscaping
- 6 Keep grasses mowed to a maximum height of four inches
- 7 Address is clearly marked and well-lit at night
- 8 Prune lower branches


